### Late-Summer Heating Oil Prices

Augusta--- The Governor’s Office of Energy Independence and Security (OEIS) conducted its weekly oil survey and found that the current statewide average cash price for No. 2 heating oil to be at **\$2.58 per gallon**, down one cent from last week.

“Crude oil prices are hovering under \$74 a barrel and inventories of petroleum and petroleum products are rising,” said OEIS Director John Kerry. “The market remains pessimistic about the pace of the economic recovery and its impact on oil demand and U.S. fuel and oil stockpiles are at their highest level in almost 27 years. Homeowners preparing for the heating oil season and considering weatherization options have one more week to take advantage of Efficiency Maine’s additional \$1,000 bonus for eligible home energy improvements if they sign up by August 31.”

It is important to note that the price for heating oil is a statewide average and that prices in a given geographic region of the state may be considerably higher or lower than the statewide average. Within the OEIS sample, the lowest actual heating oil price of \$2.18 per gallon was found in the Southwest region. The highest price of \$2.76 per gallon was found in the Eastern region. The statewide kerosene price average is \$2.94 per gallon at this time. The statewide average for propane based on a use of 600 gallons a year is \$2.64 per gallon. The table above provides current Maine cash prices in dollars rounded to the nearest penny. At the time of this release the price of WTI crude oil, a major driver of refined product prices, including heating oil was \$73.64.
