

EV owners in Maine can participate in demand management to deliver benefits to the grid.

Efficiency Maine offers residential electric vehicle owners an incentive to use our platform to help them reduce the power they draw from the electric grid when there is a forecast for peak demand. The platform will automatically delay vehicle charging until later in the evening when electricity is less expensive and less carbon-intensive to produce.

When enrolled to use the platform, a participant simply plugs their car in as they normally would, and Efficiency Maine will automatically delay their vehicle from charging on certain days with peak grid conditions. Participants are always able to override the delay in charging to accommodate their transportation needs.
