Efficiency Maine Introduction

- Runs the State's energy efficiency programs
- Provides rebates, financing, technical information, and registry of vendors
- Funded by electric and natural gas ratepayers, Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, ISO New England Grid, grants, and other sources
- Board appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legislature



LD 256 An Act to Add Electric Bicycles to the Electric Vehicle Rebate Program

- Signed by Governor Mill on 6/8/2023
- Adds e-bikes as eligible type of vehicle under Efficiency Maine EV Program
- Focuses on low- and moderate-income individuals and entities that support them



RFP EM-012-2024 Request for Proposals for Electric Bike Pilot



Purpose of this RFP

- Demonstrate the use of e-bikes in Maine
- Offset transportation from fossil fuel vehicles
- Support entities serving low- to moderate-income individuals



Incentives

- Total funding available: \$50,000
- Up to 100% of eligible costs
- Eligible costs
 - E-bikes
 - Shipping of e-bikes
 - Extended warranties or maintenance contracts for a period not to exceed three years, paid as an upfront, lump-sum cost



Ineligible Costs for the Incentive

- All operating costs, including:
 - Personnel wages and benefits
 - Rent
 - Electricity bills
 - Management and legal costs
 - Insurance
- E-bike personal protective equipment (e.g., helmets)
- E-bike storage (e.g., locks)



Eligible Locations

- Anywhere within Maine
- Preference for proposals in or near the following towns:
 - Auburn/Lewiston
 - Bangor
 - Portland



Scoring Criteria

- Plan (60 points)
 - Does the proposal make a convincing case for the benefits of e-bikes to the operations of the host entity?
 - Are e-bikes a viable solution to transportation challenges that the host entity and/or clientele is/are facing?

Budget (20 points)

- Is the proposal competitive on costs relative to other similar proposals?
- Readiness (15 points)
 - To what extent are the key participants in the project (host entity, staff, equipment provider) identified and committed to the project?
 - How compelling is the proposal's evidence or explanation about why the host entity is likely to be sustainable and remain beyond the 3-year term?
 - How qualified are the proposed project participants in terms of demonstrated experience and capacity to execute this type of project?
 - How soon does the bid propose to purchase and use the e-bike(s)?
 - Is the proposed timeline sensible, reasonable, and likely to be met?

Overall quality and responsiveness (5 points)

- What is the overall quality of the proposal submission, including but not limited to completeness, clarity, attention to detail, adherence to instructions and requirements, and lack of errors?
- Does the proposal reflect and respond to the Trust's priorities as described in the RFP?
- Does the proposal include adequate supporting documentation and data to validate the project as proposed?
