<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Attic</b> – The combination of all attics and/or cathedral ceilings, including all floors, walls and slopes that are exposed to any attic area.</li> <li>• <b>Wall</b> – The combination of all exterior (framed) walls of a home (excludes mobile home walls).</li> <li>• One of the following:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. <b>Basement</b> – The combination of all floors that separate conditioned space from unconditioned space or outside air (e.g., a basement ceiling) and/or any concrete foundation wall, including the floor of a mobile home on a foundation.</li> <li>b. <b>Mobile Home Underbelly</b> – The space beneath the floor of a mobile home that is not on a foundation.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
